Dr. Georges Goma has asked me to write a letter of recommendation for him. I am very happy to do so.

I first meet Dr. Goma during the summer of 2006 while I was in Paris delivering a series of presentations on Black identity. After one of these presentations Dr. Goma and I engaged in a lengthy conversation comparing identity issues amongst Black people in the United States, Europe and Africa. I found his depth of understanding of these issues and his ability to communicate his ideas fascinating. Since that meeting we have developed a professional relationship and a friendship that has grown significantly. When a part-time position in my department (Social Work) became available, I did not hesitate to recommend him to the faculty and to hire him for the position. He has taught a range of course for us, ranging from social welfare policy, to race, gender and inequality, to human behavior in the social environment. His international and comparative experience has been invaluable to our students. Given the level of social work involvement with immigrate population from around the world; this knowledge has been invaluable to our students.

He is a citizen of the world, being from the Congo, a citizen of France and now quite familiar with the customs and cultures of the United States he would bring an added value to any institution.
